


If any part is missing, please contact your dealer immediately for replacement.

AC Mains Voltage Setting

If the AC mains voltage of your power outlet and the setting of the AC supply voltage on your unit do not match, contact your dealer, contractor or a qualified service workshop to change the setting of the AC voltage selector. The AC voltage selector switch is located on the side panel of the unit, close to the AC inlet.

Linkoustic™ Wireless Audio Link

If your product is fitted with the optional Linkoustic™ wireless audio link, you can enjoy the ease of wireless audio replay from compatible devices. Operation is simple and convenient:

- When powering the unit on, it will be ready to pair with a Linkoustic[™]-compatible device, indicated by the pairing LED (19) blinking.
- It will then automatically pair with the previously known compatible device if this device is available. The LED will then be constantly lit.
- If no previously known device is available, the unit will keep being available for pairing, which is indicated by the pairing LED (19) blinking, until a pairing process is executed from a new compatible device. Once paired with this new compatible device, the pairing LED (19) will turn to be constantly lit.
- If during the "ready to pair" status (LED blinking) or the "paired" status (LED on) the button is pressed and held for a prolonged period, the wireless audio link will be turned off. The pairing LED (19) will then be off. Pressing the button again, will turn the wireless audio link on again and the same process starts as from powering the unit on.




Rack/Cabinet Mounting

This product comes pre-assembled with 19" rack ears and handles. Depending on the location of installation and use, it might be commendable to remove either only the handles, or both the rack ears and handles. To do so, remove the screws at the side panel of the units as shown: To remove the handle (H), remove the single center screw out of the group of 3 screws at the front side of the metal cabinet. Pull the handles out to the front. To also remove the rack ears (E), remove the remaining two screws and then remove the rack ear.

For a qualified technician to change the AC voltage setting, the AC cord

shall be detached, the security cover (C) shall be flipped up, and the Voltage selector switch (S) shall be set to the new position. Afterwards, the

security cover (C) shall be set back into a protective position to avoid





Removal / Retrofit of wireless option (Linkoustic™)


Depending on the location and period of purchase, your product may be fitted with a Linkoustic™ wireless audio receiver option. This is not in all applications a wanted feature, and may be removed by the installer when required. Likewise, if at any point of time required, it may be retrofitted again. For the latter purpose, keep all removed parts in a safe and dry storage location. To start removing the wireless audio receiver option, follow the below procedure.

- **Equalizer for priority microphone channel "M"**. Allows the adjustment of the tonal balance for the priority microphone in two frequency bands with an adjustment range of ±12dB.
- Talkover Damping Control for priority microphone channel "M". This control determines the amount of damping applied to the program signal when the priority microphone is spoken into. Being fully turned clockwise, once speaking into the microphone, the program signal is completely suppressed. Being turned fully counterclockwise, the talkover function is off. Any position in between allows seamless adjustment of the amount of damping applied to the program signal. The threshold level from which on this function is enabled can be set by the rear panel threshold level control (5).
- Main (stereo) output level control. Determines the main output level present at the main stereo output (2).
- Main (stereo) output level meter. Displays the output level of the stereo main output (2). Note that the level limitation applied by means of the rear-side maximum level control (4) is not displayed on this meter.
- **PFL level.** Determines the signal volume at the headphone output (31). Always set this control to minimum before putting on headphones, as sudden high-volume impact may damage your ears. See further health advice below.
- Headphones output. A 3.5mm TRS connector to connect a headphone. Turn the PFL level (30) down before plugging in any headphones.
- **Power switch.** Switches the unit on and off. Make sure to switch the unit off when not in use. The ON position is indicated by a backlight.

- Unscrew the top lid from the product and remove it. Unscrew the front panel assembly from the main body of the unit and detach it to gain access to the rear side of the front panel. (A)
- Loosen the antenna socket and unplug the antenna cable from the audio receiver PCB, then remove the antenna. Also remove the relative switch cap. (B)
- Re-assemble the unit and close the open apertures with the provided rubber plugs. (C)





About this product

The PAA-71 is a 7-Channel mic/line mixer with 5 multi-purpose mic/line inputs, one dedicated microphone input and talkover feature. All inputs feature EQ's and Gain control. The balanced output is provided both on TRS jacks as well as Phoenix-compatible connectors. Remote muting and emergency signal replay facilitate the use in installed sound systems. Certain versions of this product may be fitted with an additional Linkoustic™ wireless audio received module.




Configuration

The PAA71 can be configured to meet certain operational requirements by setting internal jumpers. As a factory default, all jumpers are set to the OFF position.





To change the jumper settings, unscrew the top lid from the product and remove it. The jumpers are located on the rear PCB assembly as per following illustration and functional description:




- Wireless Audio Link antenna. If your product is fitted with the optional Linkoustic™ wireless audio link, then this is the antenna mounting position.
- Wireless Audio Link pair button. If your product is fitted with the optional Linkoustic™ wireless audio link, then this button invokes pairing and un-pairing functionality. Refer to the chapter for the operation of the Linkoustic™ wireless audio link.
- Wireless Audio Link status LED. If your product is fitted with the optional Linkoustic™ wireless audio link, then this LED indicates the current operational status. Refer to the chapter for the operation of the Linkoustic™ wireless audio link.
- AUX Input for Channel A. This is a 3.5mm Mini-TRS stereo socket which allows the connection of sources like MP3 players etc. without removing the mixer from its mounting position. Once a plug is inserted, the optional Linkoustic™ wireless audio link is disabled and the source connected to this 3.5mm Mini-TRS is active. Note that Channel A can also be re-routed via the source switch (21) to play the signal from the rear-side balanced TRS audio input ("FOH").
- Source switch for Channel A. This switch assigns either the rearside balanced TRS audio input ("FOH") to Channel A, or the optional Linkoustic™ wireless audio link (which itself can be disabled and replaced by inserting a source to the 3.5mm Mini-TRS). Release the button (the control LED in the switch cap is off) to activate the rearside balanced TRS audio input ("FOH"), or press the switch (the control LED in the switch cap is lit) to activate the optional Linkoustic™ wireless audio link / 3.5mm Mini-TRS input.
- Volume control for channel A. Controls the volume of the signal inserted in the balanced rear-panel input (16) or the front-panel TRS input (20) / optional Linkoustic[™] wireless audio link respectively.
- Volume controls for channels 1/2/3/4/5. Control the volume of the signal inserted in the rear-panel microphone inputs (12) or line inputs (13) depending on the setting of the source selector switch (14). The maximum attainable volume is adjustable by the rear-panel gain control (15).
- **Equalizer for channels 1/2/3/4/5.** Allows the adjustment of the tonal balance for the respective input in two frequency bands with an adjustment range of ±12dB.
- VOLUME control for priority microphone channel "M". Controls the volume of the signal inserted in the rear-panel priority microphone input (10). The maximum attainable volume is adjustable by the rear-panel gain control (11).

- **Line** input for CH1/2/3/4/5. These dual RCA connectors provide inputs for line-level signals to the assigned channels.
- Source selector switch for CH1/2/3/4/5. Allows to switch the input source between the connected LINE signal (13) or microphone signal (14) of the respective channel.
- **GAÍN control** for input channels 1/2/3/4/5. This allows the sensitivity (input gain) for every input to be adjusted, so that sources of different output level can be mixed at properly balanced levels.
- LINE input for channel A (FOH). This is a ½" TRS balanced stereo input specifically designed to allow the connection of the output of a stage mixer or any other balanced audio source at larger distance, in order to use the connected sound system for the replay of such source's signal. This is useful in applications where e.g. apart from stereo source replay also live music is performed over the same sound system, or where a source signal from a different room/area needs to be replayed. The volume of this input is controlled by a rotary front-panel control (22). Note that this input is disabled when a connector is inserted into the front-panel AUX jack (20).



- Microphone phantom power setting (CH1....5). While most applications will work well with dynamic microphones, on certain occasions the use of a condenser microphone may be required. To supply the necessary voltage to the microphone, the PAA71 provides an internal option to activate phantom power, separately for the priority microphone (microphone channel "M") and for all other microphone inputs (CH1...CH5). Please note that the phantom power settings for channels 1-5 can only be made globally, not individually. Set the jumper to ON if required. Note that the phantom power is set to 12V DC, which is sufficient for most microphone used in installation applications, but may not work with studio recording microphones which may demand up to 48V.
- **Microphone phantom power setting (CH M).** As per above explanation, this jumper sets the phantom power for the microphone channel individually.
- Microphone emergency priority setting. In the case of an external emergency signal muting the unit's outputs, an internal jumper can be set to either mute the connected microphones ("off") as well or to to keep them active (so that aside of a emergency message broadcasted, additional instructions can be given by a local microphone "on"). To make the setting, locate and set the jumper on the rear PCB as shown above.

Controls and Connections



- AC inlet and fuse holder. Use the supplied AC cord to connect the unit to AC mains. Make sure voltage and frequency stated and set on the unit comply with your local AC supply. The fuse can be accessed by the small drawer at the AC inlet. To change the fuse, unplug the AC cord first, pull out the fuse drawer and replace the fuse ONLY with a fuse of SAME voltage and rating. If the fuse blows again after replacement, hand over the unit to qualified service personnel.
- Stereo Main output. This is a balanced terminal block output carrying the main output signal controlled by the main volume control (28).
- Mono switch for main output. Sums the left and right channel to a mono signal when pressed. The signal is then available on both the L and R outputs of the stereo main output (2).

- Maximum level setting for Stereo Main output. This control allows to limit the maximum level at the stereo main output (2) in order to match the connected sound system. Adjustments made on this control will not be displayed by the output level meter (29). Adjustments shall be made with a small screw driver. Note that the total angle is 300 degrees; do not apply excessive force with the screw driver.
- Talkover threshold adjustment for Stereo Main output. This control allows to set the level at which the talkover is enabled. The amount of damping which is applied once the talkover is active (DPG) is set by a front panel control (27). Adjustments shall be made with a small screw driver. Note that the total angle is 300 degrees; do not apply excessive force with the screw driver.
- **Record output.** This is an unbalanced stereo output carrying the same signal as the stereo main outputs (2), but not influenced by the main volume control (28). This is normally used for recording the output to an external tape, CD or memory device.
- Music Mute input. This is a terminal block input which allows to remotely mute the stereo main output (2) by simply shortening the contacts.
- Emergency input. This is an auto-sensing, balanced terminal block input which allows the connection to an emergency evacuation system. Once a signal is present on this input, the stereo main output signal (2) will be muted and the emergency message/signal from this input will become audible instead. Note that the unit can be set to include or exclude the microphone signals from this muting process, please see section "configuration".
- Emergency volume control. This control allows to set the level with which the signal fed into the emergency input (8) will be replayed at the stereo main output (2).
- **Priority microphone input "M".** This is a balanced terminal block input with adjustable priority over other signals by means of the talkover control (5) and the damping control (27). Phantom power can be enabled or disabled depending on the connected microphone type, see section "configuration".
- **Gain control** for priority microphone input. "M" This allows the sensitivity (input gain) for input (10) to be adjusted to match different microphone output levels.
- **Microphone** input for CH1/2/3/4/5. These are balanced terminal block inputs, which can be internally set to either carry phantom power or not, thus these inputs can be used both with condenser and dynamic microphones. Please see section "configuration". The signal of these inputs is controlled by the front panel controls (23)/(24).
